Dear Parents,

Praised be Jesus Christ now and forever! May the Holy Spirit dwell within your families and homes. I pray that the blessings of this Easter season are bearing fruit in the spiritual lives of each of your families. I write this letter to you to announce this summer's high school religious education offerings. For those of you with an 8th grade student the high school program works differently than the middle school program. Students are invited to choose subjects which they will take for 6-7 weeks. Please let the students pick their electives. The electives exist for students who may be interested in one topic over another. The summary of the various classes can be found on the back of this letter. We want students to be engaged which works better if they are interested in the particular topic. There are **six** required classes and **two** electives that must be taken in order to be put into the junior year discipleship program.

Our program is designed to be flexible with busy schedules. If a student has a busy quarter, he/she can take that quarter off of religious education and take a class over the summer. Students can take classes in the summer between 8th grade and their freshman year, during their freshman year, the summer between their freshman and sophomore years and the summer after their sophomore year. This affords students a lot of flexibility with their schedule. The **Theology of the Body** course (which is required) is never offered during the summer and must be taken during the school year. Each year there are a minimum of six classes offered during the summer-three electives and three required courses. The program can be completed by simply attending during the school year but the summer classes provide the opportunity for flexibility with schedules.

Given that a student may take a varying number of classes each year, the fee for each class taken is a flat \$25 rate. This does not amount to any extra cost to families as a full year of religious education is \$100 (4 classes in the 4 quarters of the school year). Students and families that want to take more than eight classes will not be assessed any further fee. This means that once the six required and two electives are taken that every class after that is free of charge.

Additionally, students who attend the **Steubenville Youth Conference** will receive credit for the Prayer Elective. Also, students who attend the **Love Begins Here** work camp will receive credit for a service elective. Information on these opportunities can be found on our parish website under the youth ministry page or by contact Maria Fannin at mfannin@stmarygreenville.org or 757-6555 ext.240. I strongly encourage all students to attend these programs as they are excellent opportunities to grow in faith outside of the classroom and provide a deep conversion experience. Our faith is lived not just learned. Obviously, these opportunities have a separate cost but they will not be accessed the \$25 cost per class. However, please don't let cost be the reason your children don't attend these events. There are fundraising and scholarship opportunities to help defray cost.
